**Dear Friends in Christ:**

Today is the 4th and the last Sunday of Advent before Christmas, and all four candles are lit in the Advent wreath. Indeed, we are at the threshold of Christmas and the birth of Baby Jesus is now imminent. In a few hours we will be celebrating the memory of that great event.

Throughout Advent, we have heard of God's promise to send a Liberator - a Savior into the world; today, we catch a glimpse of how that is to be accomplished and to some extent, we can associate with the greatest joy of the Blessed Virgin Mary who awaited the coming of Baby Jesus into the world.

Today, we are standing right at the front door of Christmas and before we enter, Mary has been presented to us, this last Sunday of Advent to be our model. Let us follow her example of faith & holiness, humility & simplicity, obedience & surrender to the will of God, as we await the coming of our Saviour into the world and into our lives.

Obviously, God's choice of Mary to be the Mother of His Son was special. So was her response, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Mary freely accepted the fact that she had been chosen to be the mother of the Messiah and surrendered herself to the will of God. Mary listened and humbly answered the invitation, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

Just as God had freely chosen to give, Mary had also freely chosen to accept. And with her simple 'Fiat', her unhesitating 'Yes', Mary changed the course of salvation history forever. God becomes one of us. God is present among us.

But God has also chosen all of us for something special. For this, like Mary, we are also favoured. What has been our response to God's choice of us? Consequently, like Mary, we are challenged to use our freedom and respond with our 'yes' to God's call. Merry Christmas my Friends.

**JOHN OF KANTY (or CANTIUS)  
FEAST DAY – DECEMBER 23**

John of Kanty was born near Oswiecim in Poland on June 23, 1390. He came from a family that lived in the country, but they were fairly well off. He was sent to the university in the big city of Kraków, Poland, where he did well.

John was ordained priest, and appointed as a professor in the University. He was falsely accused there by jealous university rivals, and lost his position. At age 41, he was assigned as a parish priest at Olkusz, Bohemia. He was not comfortable with this kind of responsibility, which was so different from teaching, but did his best. At first, his parishioners did not accept him, but in the end he won their hearts.

After several years in his parish, John returned to his beloved University and taught Scripture there for the rest of his life. He became increasingly famous for his teaching, his humble and austere way of living and his spontaneous generosity. He made four pilgrimages to Rome, carrying his own luggage on his back. When he was warned to take care of his health, he said that the early desert fathers lived long lives in conditions "that had nothing to recommend them but the presence of God".

John was a gifted communicator, and this gift helped him become a fine teacher. Perhaps his best lesson for us, especially in these days of instant communication, can be found in his favorite sayings to his pupils: 'Fight all false opinions, but let your weapons be patience, sweetness and love. Roughness is bad for your own soul and spoils the best cause.'

At the time of his death, St. John Kanty was so well loved that his veneration began immediately. For years, his doctoral gown was worn by graduates receiving advanced degrees at the University. He was beatified and named patron of Poland and Lithuania in 1737 by Pope Clement XII. Ninety-one years after his beatification, he was [canonized](#) on July 16, 1767 by [Pope Clement XIII](#)

#### What is the feast of Christmas all about? What are its messages?

-Christmas is an event of love, it is a feast of love: John in his



Gospel says, **"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that whoever believes in him, will not perish, but will have eternal life."**

Christmas is God's self-gift laid in human hands, in the person of Jesus Christ for the salvation of mankind and it really tells how magnanimously God loves us and cares for us.

-Christmas is an event of joy, it is a feast of joy: The angel said to the shepherds, **"Do not be afraid; for see--I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, Who is the Messiah, the Lord."**

-Christmas is an event of peace, it is a feast of peace: And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: **"Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."** . That peace is the shalom of God - life experienced in all its fullness, richness, and completeness in accord with the will of God.

But lastly, the real meaning of Christmas actually is 'Emmanuel,' God-with-us -God revealing Himself to us; God bringing us forgiveness, healing, comfort, moral strength, guidance. Each one of us has, deep down in our soul, an incredible hunger: a hunger to be in the presence of God.

As we celebrate the incarnation of the Word of God this Christmas, we must make a conscious effort, both to remember that Jesus is always with us, especially in the Eucharist, and to share our joy in His presence with others. So let's go home to the heart of Christmas and embrace Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

Christmas asks all of us a tough question. If Jesus were to come today, how would he come? As a matter of fact, he is already there standing and knocking at the door. Do we close the doors of our hearts to Jesus, who is looking for a place to be reborn in our lives?
